What is an Audiologist?

An Audiologist is a specialist in the field of hearing health. Audiologists have a minimum of a Masters Degree in Audiology and spend an average of seven years at university learning their profession.

A family doctor keeps a record of your medical history so if any conditions arise, they can be followed and effectively treated. Audiologists work the same way, but for them to keep a detailed history you need to visit your hearing health professional regularly. Make a yearly appointment with an Audiologist. They examine your overall hearing and prescribe and fit hearing instruments. Audiologists are also trained to provide counseling to individuals who are learning to cope with the practical and emotional repercussions of hearing loss.
